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would do to change existing, it adds a statement of legislative intent which is something that has been added in almost every sunset proposed legislation, that is the general statement of intent for the purpose of that board. It strikes the termination of the board. It allows it to continue. It adds the possibility of a lay member to represent consumer viewpoint which again is a provision that has been added to almost every one of these boards over the last five years and then it is a five year term for that lay member, consistent with the others. It establishes a range of fees for the board to cover their cost of administrative costs and again this is what we have done in a number of instances is put in a range for these various boards which then can be adjusted by them periodically if necessary because of their budget but the control as to how high it goes is in the level of the appropriation. There is a lot of minor things that...or adjustments that are made. For example the old law said that only a chairman and vice-chairman could sign certificates of registration. It would permit any two members of the board to sign. You recall a lot of these boards, the people are not necessarily right here in Lincoln or they may be in a variety of places around the state and this makes it more convenient for them to operate. It changes the process, making it consistent with other agencies for renewals particularly if they have lapsed, what process they should go through to get them renewed, the original application renewed. It grants authority to the board to put landscape architects on probation in the event that there is some infraction of rules and regulations that they should do. It requires fifteen hours of professional development as per requisite for relicensure annually. It generally allows the board to adopt the various rules and regulations to carry out the purposes that licensure is granted. That's it. Move the bill be advanced.
