for the court system in your areas. That is the issue, very simple. We are not asking for preferential treatment as you did, Senator Von Minden. We are asking for fairness and equity. Those words sometimes are forgotten and their meanings become obscure but, trust me, Senator Von Minden, this is not giving us something that is not fair or just or that you don't already have unlike some of your requests in the past. With that I urge the favorable consideration of LB 13.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of LB 13. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting on the advancement of LB 13.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. Now we are going to go to LB 56. The Clerk has to read some things in for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a Reference Report referring LBs 915 through 949.

I have a motion from Senator Hoagland to reconsider the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 68 yesterday. That will be laid over.

LB 416 and 416A have been reported to Select File with E & R amendments attached. (See page 359 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, Senator L. Johnson would ask unanimous consent to add his name to LR 240 as co-introducer.
