SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Clark, I certainly would be glad to temporarily withdraw my amendment if it is the wish of the body to lay it over. I would certainly abide by that.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, is that all right with the Chair?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, any objections?

SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will lay it over for one day.

SENATOR HEFNER: Seeing no objections, we will lay...do you want to lay over the bill one day?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, for one day or until Monday is fine.

SENATOR HEFNER: That is fine, Senator Clark. Mr. Clerk, do you have anything to read into the record?
