633 does. It is simply a bill to aid in interpretation of statutes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the explanation, all those in favor of advancing LB 633 please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. LB 634.

CLERK: 634 offered by Senator V. Johnson as Chairman of the Board. (Read title.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, we are now engaged in a series of Revisor bills that really ought not to need any discussion whatsoever. According to Joanne Pepperl, LB 634 is designed to repeal a reference to teacher tenure contract methods that was missed in 1982 when teacher tenure contract methods were altered by the passage of LB 259 in that year and our Bill Drafter simply missed the citation that ought to have been repealed at that time. That is all that LB 634 does. Incidentally, I am going to add, you might want to know why we are doing seven Revisor bills. You might want to know why we don't seem to do them in one bill because we got an Attorney General's Opinion dealing with obsolete statutes last year which indicated that there was no common theme amongst the repeal of obsolete statutes and you had to have one bill for each subject, our Bill Drafter being careful has put it together with five or six different Revisor bills.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the advancement of LB 634. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Could I have your...thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of 634, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 634 advances. LB 635.
