keep the bill alive to give the gambling lobby a vehicle for having a statewide lottery put in place and to keep themselves in a position to agitate for it. Now were I a lobbyist and paid as handsomely as those who represent the gambling interests are paid I would want to keep my income flowing too. So they don't really care whether or not this constitutional amendment stays alive and actually passes. They just want it to stay alive for the session so that they will have something to continue agitating the issue on. So now that that particular amendment has been added, some people will feel a necessity and an interest in keeping this constitutional amendment alive. I'm not going to go through the arguments I usually give against the state getting involved in gambling because that is not even the issue now. We are having a dynamic, although restrained and quiet, clash of wills here this morning. It is those who clearly see what the gambling lobby is intending and attempting to do and those who are opposed to that being done. Now I don't think there is any necessity in having an amendment like this. As has been pointed out by somebody already, an amendment like this is not necessary to let the state go into the business of gambling. There is another purpose that it serves. I have heard that those who had that statutory provision to set up a state lottery are not going to push it this year. So if they are not going to push it, there is no need to continue hiring lobbyists to try to get the state to go into gambling. So you've got to get a live issue and this is the one. Children, when they want to have fun, don't go and get the carcass of a dog and tie cans on it because the carcass can't move. They find a vigorous, feisty, live little animal and tie tin cans to that one's tail and get it running down the street. Well this is the gambling lobby's dog to which they want to tie the cans of money. Nobody would really fault them for wanting that money. That is why everybody does what they do for a living. They do it to get money and I hate to always bring it up but that is why I want the players in these big time athletic programs to get some money too. If we are going to appease the gambling lobby who do nothing constructive for the state and may be detrimental to the morals of the young people and others, the players have brought tremendous pride to people who had no basis for pride before. I have never seen such outpouring for a loser in my life as I saw this time for the football team and if that is really a
