PRESIDENT: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. LB 130, Mr. Clerk. Let's have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.)

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 130 was offered by Senator Vard Johnson. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 11, 1983. It was referred to the Education Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are Education Committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, we have some amendments from your committee to LB 130, Senator Johnson's bill, LB 130.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the committee amendment on LB 130 is relatively simple. The bill as drafted required the State Fire Marshal's safety regulations to be subject to the advice and consent of the Department of Public Welfare and it was the feeling of the committee that the State Fire Marshal should not have to ask for approval from another department. It is the duty of the State Fire Marshal's office to make certain that certain public fire and safety regulations are met and we should continue to keep those lines of authority as we have traditionally done it. So the committee amendments simply remove that provision from LB 130 that puts those regulations under the advice and consent of the Department of Public Welfare. And unless there is any other questions, I would simply move for the advancement of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the committee amendments. Is there further discussion on the amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the committee amendments.
