in Class II, III, or IV school districts, otherwise that language doesn't make any sense. All of the amendments are technical in nature, in some sense is creating new subsections and new numbering systems, in others adding phrases that perhaps will make them more applicable across the board. As I say, they came from the Bill Drafter's staff although they are a little more than E & R amendments and for that reason I have passed them out to you and urge their adoption at this time.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Landis' amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Is there anyone else here on those amendments? Is Senator Labeledz or Senator Chambers around to take up an amendment on Select File? Speaker Nichol, the LB 623, Senator Labeledz and Senator Chambers still have amendments, shall we pass over?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Therefore, we will pass over LB 623 at this time. LB 38.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments on LB 38.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lundy, do you want to handle the E & R amendments please.

SENATOR LUNDY: I move the E & R amendments be approved.
