SENATOR KAHLE: The Marsh-Hoagland amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, we are voting on advancement of LB 276 as amended. Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move we advance LB 276.

SENATOR KAHLE: All those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. The bill is advanced. LB 623.

CLERK: Mr. President, 623 was last considered on January 19. At that time the E & R amendments were adopted. There was an amendment from Senator Landis that was adopted. I now have pending an amendment from Senator Chambers, Mr. President.

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Chambers.
