SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of LB 670. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Ladies and gentlemen, it looks like I need help. Please vote if you are interested in the bill. Senator Kahle, what will we do?

SENATOR KAHLE: Well, I could tell you a story or two and maybe some of the rest of them would come back in but I don't like to do that. I don't tell stories very well. But if we could get a little help here, why we could sure move faster.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Are you saying we go under Call?

SENATOR KAHLE: Well, record I guess.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 670 is advanced. Senator Haberman has asked that we skip over 969 and go to his 976.

CLERK: Mr. President, 976 was a bill introduced by Senator Haberman. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 11. It was referred to the Ag and Environment Committee for hearing. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this bill was brought to us by the Department of Agriculture and what it does is they publish two books, a weed book and an insect book. The Pages are going to walk around and show you what these books are. Up until now we have been paying them with general funds. This bill says
