they have to be self-supporting. They are going to charge enough for publishing, distribution and updating of the books that no longer will we have to use general funds or tax dollars. We will be using money created from the sale of the books. That is all the bill does and I ask that it be advanced.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any discussion on the bill? The motion is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. If you are interested in the bill, please vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. We will move on to 977.

CLERK: Mr. President, 977 offered by Senator Haberman. (Read title.) The bill was read earlier this year. It was referred to the Ag and Environment Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this was brought to us by the Ag Department. All it does, it changes the date of the fees on inspection of all commercial weights and measures equipment, such as scales, gas pumps and etcetera. It changes the date that they should be paid from July 1 to August 1. It does not change the scale, the cost of the fees or anything of this; and, why, because they want it to fit in with all of the Ag Department's fiscal year. Now if you pass this bill, it will put all of the fees on the same year in the Ag Department and it is just a cleanup bill and I ask that you advance LB 977.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Ladies and gentlemen, if I could have your attention, we are not paying very close attention or are we sticking by very closely and we could move several of these small bills if we would just
