LB 673, 690, 995

PRESIDENT: LB 673 is advanced. Next is LB 690.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 690 was introduced by Senator DeCamp. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 4 of this year. It was referred to the Committee on Judiciary. They report the bill back to General File with no committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, in 1981 as you know and everybody knows, Legislature repealed the guest statute. Guest statute, of course, was the thing that applied to automobiles and ground transportation that said if you were a guest in a car and the driver was not guilty of gross negligence in an accident, then you couldn't recover from him cause you were just a guest. We repealed the guest statute and made it apply, of course, to all ground transportation. We forgot to do it for aircraft. This simply does the same thing for aircraft and makes it identical to ground transportation.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on LB 690? If not, all those in favor of advancing LB 690 from General File vote aye, opposed vote no. Members, please record your vote on the advancement of LB 690. We are voting on the advancement of LB 690, as explained by Senator DeCamp. Will you please record your vote? Please record your vote. We are voting on the advancement of LB 690. Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Next, we have LB 995. Is Senator Chronister available? Very good.

CLERK: 995 by Senator Chronister. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 12 of this year, referred to Business and Labor for hearing. It was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Chronister.
