SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Wesely, as I understand this, this just takes care of one year. Is this correct?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, right.

SENATOR HEFNER: Say that if this student that you were talking about was in his junior year, it would have just paid the tuition for the junior year and if he would have wanted to stay for his senior year, then he would have had to pay the tuition himself.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, yeah. That's right.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, thank you. Thank you, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Sure. You bet.

SENATOR HEFNER: I support the bill but I just wanted to make this clear and I think we need to help those students that want to finish that particular school year in this particular school. And so, therefore, I would support the bill.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is a bill designed to help families have some flexibility in their decision-making process. Many families would decide that they would pay the tuition, if they had the funds. But some families will not have that flexibility unless we pass 768. So I urge your support for the adoption of this piece of legislation to our statutes. It will particularly help a number of families in this community. Thank you.
