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SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, Mr. Clerk, I think I have an amendment up there. I've also got a kill motion filed on it, I believe.

CLERK: Senator, you do. The amendment...is your amendment to the committee amendment though because we haven't adopted the committee amendments yet?

SENATOR VICKERS: No.

CLERK: Okay, then we'll get to those in due order.

SENATOR VICKERS: So we're back to the Schmit amendment?

CLERK: Yes sir.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, fine.

CLERK: Mr. President, I then have an amendment to the committee amendments offered by Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the amendment which I offer strikes the Fenger amendment that was previously adopted, also strikes the Schmit amendment that was adopted at the same time that we adopted the Fenger amendment. Those of us, including Senator Vickers and Senator Wesely and a few others, who had some concern with the language got together and agreed that we would follow this course. I would move the adoption of the amendment. I wish that Senator Fenger would comment on it, and also perhaps Senator Vickers.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Fenger.

SENATOR FENGER: Thank you, Mr. President. As we discussed this the other day, on General File, there was a concensus that some of the people involved, who felt strongly about this issue, should get together. It is my understanding that the amendment offered by Senator Schmit is the result
