SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the amendment that is up there now would strike Sections 2 through 9 of the bill. So in other words, it strikes the whole bill except Section 1 and that is in part because the Bar Association had some objections in those sections and because I was not completely happy with some of those sections. So in order to eliminate controversy on the bill, we're striking everything but Section 1. And then the other thing that the amendment does is simply to rewrite one of the sections that we struck and this particular section has to do with the liability of someone who is in the employ of a library in instances where they may stop somebody and
