minor fiscal note on this bill is because those people presently buying permits in some cases may no longer buy them. But I think this fiscal note is probably too high because many people will continue to get permits because they are transferable. Once again, I want to emphasize this bill does not broaden the criteria and allow more people to park in those stalls, but simply to make it easier for some who are already eligible. And I noticed Senator Kilgarin voted red on this because of the physical handicap. This was taken off by the request of those people. They felt that they could not get a handicapped license and they felt that this should be off, that this should not be included in...in that bill. I urge you...urge the adoption of the amendment, of the bill.
