Mr. President, LR 257 and 258 are ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 257 and 258.

Mr. President, LR 266 by Senator Rod Johnson. (Read LR 266 as found on pages 1015-16 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Very well. The first order of business is resolution 261 by Senator Warner...Wagner, excuse me.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 261 was introduced by Senator Wagner and a number of the other members. (Read LR 261.) Mr. President, the resolution is on page 954 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. President, speakers, the resolution does two things. It recognizes the people that first started the Living Snow Fence Program, the structured Snow Fence Program there in Valley County and at the same time it goes on to recognize the Game and Parks Commission and the Soil Conservation Service, the Natural Resource Districts and the landowners and the people involved in creating the Living Snow Fence. And after this last blizzard we have had, why anybody that has got them, it certainly is a help to control that snow. And passed out is a colored brochure that indicates and it is the picture of the first living...structured living snow fence out west of Ord. It is a good program, and (inaudible) wildlife, and I would encourage the adoption of the resolution.
