PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz, we are informed, is on her way here to take up the matter. We are ready to take up your motion to reconsider LB 466A, Senator Labeledz. Sorry to bother you from your...take you away from your work.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President, I'm afraid the balance of the committee may have to come in here because I understand I am going to need 30 votes...

PRESIDENT: That is correct.

SENATOR LABEDZ: ...to suspend the rules. Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I ask your support this morning to suspend the rules in order to reconsider LB 466A. Because we adopted the Beutler amendment to LB 466 which eliminated the fiscal impact to the state, we were under the impression that the A bill on LB 466 was unnecessary. However, the fiscal office informed us that a special appropriation bill was necessary because there will need to be a transfer of funds from the Department of Revenue which will administer the tax return checkoff to the Game and Parks Commission. I would, therefore, ask you to suspend the rules to reconsider LB 466 and then we will vote for the reconsideration. And then, of course, we will have to adopt the amendment to LB 466A. There is no fiscal impact as far as the general fund is concerned. The money will come from
