CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

PRESIDENT: The Committee report is confirmed and adopted. The Chair would announce that Senators Kahle and Lundy have four exchange students from Kearney who are here from Mexico, Finland, India, and Germany. CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, I have an explanation of vote from Senator Sieck and I have a report of registered lobbyists for the week of February 16 through 23. (See pages 1110-1111 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, Legislative Bill 979 was introduced by Senator Beutler. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 12, referred to the Judiciary Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this bill would simply make a criminal, an existing criminal provision which was applicable to industrials and to cooperative credits, credit associations and to banks and to trust companies and to S & L's, it would simply make this criminal provision applicable to credit unions in the state.
