SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, LB 336.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 336...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I think it would be unfair for me to take this bill up until the other bill has had a fair chance so I will pass over it and let them be together, whatever, in the future. I think that is the only fair...I think this Legislature has a lot of very important things and I am willing to let us get to them.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I don't think that is what he meant but, nevertheless, if there is no objection we will pass over 336 and 336A. Okay, LB 645. Thank you, Senator DeCamp.

CLERK: Mr. President, 645 offered by Senator Harris. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 4, referred to the Education Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Education Committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, the amendments to 645.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the committee amendments to LB 645 are principally technical in nature. They define the term "instructional technology" in relation to the bill and they also remove the language or clarifies that the Department of Education would not have authority over the postsecondary part of 645, over the technology that is to be used for postsecondary education. So that the committee amendments are basically a technical amendment to clarify the intent of LB 645 and I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, did you wish to speak to this? Senator DeCamp. Your lights are on. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption
