PRESIDENT: Senator Newell, do you want to have Senator Nichol come in or not? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. The Call of the House is raised. Do you have anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, one item, Senator Newell would like to print amendments to LB 341 in the Journal. (See pages 1217-1219 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: So recorded. We proceed now to the priority bills, LB 695.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 695 introduced by Senators Labeledz, DeCamp and Higgins. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 4 of this year. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz, do you wish to explain your bill?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Sorry, I was a little confused. I thought we were going to change the agenda but evidently we are not.

PRESIDENT: I haven't had any word on it, Senator.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Was there something that you understood that...?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, but that is okay, I'll go on with it.

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR LABEDZ: The Speaker isn't here. LB 695 represents the most that I can do to provide protection for the weakest
