CLERK: Senator Abboud voting yes.

PRESIDENT: May we have quiet in the Chamber, please, so the Clerk can hear the vote. Proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 1257 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Just a minute about what we are going to be doing the next few days. Senator Chambers says my time is up. (laughter) The next few days...today, of course, it is no secret, and it's up to you to go as far as you want to go.
