PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on LB 760? If not, no closing, John. All in favor of advancing LB 760 vote aye, opposed vote no. With so many excused this morning, we need the help of everybody on the floor, very likely, to work through consent calendar. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: LB 760 is persuasively advanced. LB 1105.

CLERK: (Read title of LB 1105.) The bill was read on January 18, referred to the Banking Commerce and Insurance Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.
