LB 783, 764

City of Omaha is suffering some financial problems. All those in favor of advancing LB 783 vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to advance LB 783. Please record your vote. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance 783.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 764.

CLERK: Mr. President, 764 introduced by Senator Chambers. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 4, referred to the Education Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, for the committee amendments.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the committee amendments says, as Senator Chambers so adequately pointed out to you with the handout that he provided to you, eliminated the concern that UNL had about LB 764 in that it makes the language of 764 consistent with NCAA rules and that is the committee amendments. It doesn't change the intent of the bill, or at least it is designed not to. I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, all those in favor of adopting the committee amendments vote aye, opposed vote no. There is a
