establishment of a petty cash fund not to exceed a thousand dollars to be used when the Bureau of Vital Statistics has to send refunds to people who overpay when requesting copies of records. The Bureau has found the present \$150.00 limit on its petty cash fund to be insufficient and to efficiently meet the demands for refunds. The bill also provides for the preparation of birth certificate for births not occurring in hospitals, establishes a cremation permit to be signed by the county attorney where the death occurred, clarifies provisions relating to the disinterment, transportation of bodies outside the state and eliminates the outmoded yet currently required burial permit. I would also advise the body that at our request Mr. Dick Beck from the Department of Health is under the north balcony to answer any specific questions you may have. With that I would move the advancement of LB 676, sir.
