add an ex officio member to the board from the College of Engineering and Technology and the College of Architecture. We update the registration process for architects permitting for outstate registration consistent with the normal practice and we make a few changes to existing law in which we had very minute responsibilities for farm buildings placed into statute. Senator Vickers saw those and we struck those from the bill as well. LB 516 is the product of rather considerable discussion over the summer with the engineers who had a tough time giving up any of the provisions of their bill but the committee actually cut the bill back to a reappropriation of the board and several narrow advancements in the operation of an up-to-date Board of Engineering and Architects professional standards. I would move the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Withem, are you going to take this?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I certainly can. I really have nothing...I think Senator Landis in explaining the committee amendments, in fact, explained the bill. The only further reason I would urge you to support this bill is this will be the last chance to give my predecessor in this position a vote. This is probably Senator Doyle's last bill so I would appreciate a vote for that reason also. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement...oh, excuse me, Senator Vickers, your light is on, do you wish it to be on? Okay, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the advancement of the bill. Record, Mr. Clerk.
