SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 920 is advanced. LB 1058.

CLERK: Mr. President, very quickly before that, Senator Barrett would like to print amendments to 801A; Senator Landis and Nichol to 471; Senator Warner to 826. Senator Wesely would like to add his name to 975. (See pages 1278-1279 of the Legislative Journal.)

Banking Committee reports 954 to General File with amendments, and 1026 is reported correctly engrossed, Mr. President. (See page 1279 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, 1058 was a bill (read title.) The bill was read on January 17. It was referred to the Ag and Environment Committee. There are committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Dick Peterson.

SENATOR R. PETERSON: Mr. President, members, the committee amendments we do not need them now and so I ask that you vote against the committee amendments and we need the original bill as it was originally written to comply with Iowa, Missouri, and Kansas and they have to have the original going through their Legislature and it is in the process. So I ask for your red vote to do away with the committee amendments. We do not need them.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I rise to oppose these amendments and the reason why I oppose them is because whenever a state enters into an multistate compact the wording of these compacts have to be identical.
