SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, did you wish to speak to the amendment? Okay.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the language in the amendment that's being offered by Senator Lundy and myself is language that's exactly like the language that's in 85-948 which is the section of the statutes that deals with nursing training and that language was designed in 85-948 to bring about some conformity and some coordination between the different entities who provide nursing training, namely, the University of Nebraska, Kearney State College and some of the tech schools. The idea here as Senator Lundy and Senator Kahle have both mentioned is that we are cognizant of the problem that we are concerned about that we do not have a lot of duplication of unnecessary things but if we are, in fact, going to provide access and this is one way to do it, then we want to make certain that there is coordination and discussion about how those programs are developed and how they are delivered. That is what the amendment is all about and I would urge its adoption, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Scofield, did you wish to speak to the amendment, please?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: I would just also like to add my support to this amendment. One of the primary concerns and rightly so is efficient use of the state's resources and I think this proposed amendment assures discussion among the state colleges and the university system and will encourage the best use of the limited resources we have in this state.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Kahle, did you wish to speak again to this? Okay. Senator Vickers. The question is the adoption of the amendment by Senator Vickers and Senator Lundy. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. If you care to vote on the amendment, please do so. Record, Mr. Clerk.
