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people that have OTBs or off track betting places right now have long leases. They have loans from the banks to pay off. If we don't grandfather them in, then we are going to take all of those small businessmen and we in this Legislature will bankrupt them. I don't want to be responsible for putting anyone into bankruptcy. And as far as Senator Hefner saying they are not legal, Senator Hefner is saying that the Nebraska State Supreme Court doesn't know what they are doing because their case has been argued in the various courts in Nebraska and the Nebraska State Supreme Court said this is legal. Now I don't want to be the one to go over there and tell Krivosha and the rest of them that they don't know what they are doing. A legal loophole, no, it may be a legal technicality but not a loophole. Loopholes are for big corporations, nonprofit corporations that don't want to pay their fair share of taxes. That is where you get loopholes. But, Senators, I would urge the adoption of this amendment simply because we have an obligation to these people who have incurred heavy debts, leases and they deserve the right to be able to continue their business so that they do not have to go into bankruptcy and they do not lose everything that they have invested. Some of them may have their life savings in this business. So I would urge you to adopt the amendment and remember off track betting is legal. The Nebraska Supreme Court has said it is legal. And the only people opposed to it are those who want to be a monopoly. I don't think any Senator on this floor who says he is for private enterprise wants to put these people out of business unless he is for a monopoly. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, what about we put this whole thing in a constitutional amendment and we send it to the people to vote on? This one, and there is a couple more on this green copy, I think the next six bills we could probably put on a motion there, put them in a constitutional amendment and we could send them to the vote of the people. It is just a thought. Maybe we could think of it in that way and maybe Senator Pappas would like to see these issues go to a vote of the
