LB 820, 985

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I move the amendment. You'll find this on page 970 and 971 of the Journal. It's in two parts. The first part clarifies the intention of the bill. If you'll remember, this bill requires that a liquor dealer post only one bond with the Liquor Control Commission even if he or she has more than one license at the same location or premise. The second part adds the emergency clause. Bonds come up for renewal this spring. I think it's either in April or May and this would save the, the liquor retailers a little money. And so, Mr. President, I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the adoption of the first part of the Hefner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. If some of the Senators in the Rotunda would please return, perhaps we could avoid a Call of the House. I urge your cooperation. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, how many are excused?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk. Didn't mean to avoid your question.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Hefner's amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The first half of the amendment is adopted. Senator Hefner. I stand corrected. It was the amendment.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Move the advancement of LB 820.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. LB 985.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have with respect to 985 are E & R amendments.
