

county attorney says, well I can't do a thing about that. The judges are on a different standard. Well what can I do about it? Why he said, there is such a thing as a Judicial Qualification Commission which consists of ten people and one is Judge Krivosha, the Supreme Court judge and then there is three other judges, three attorneys and three lay people and I might tell you sometimes the lay people are wives or husbands of the judges or attorneys and he said well then it is kind of stacked against me. Well he said, look at it any way you want. But, nevertheless, I'm going to write this Qualification Commission Board. So you sit down and you write a letter to the Qualification Commission Board stating your complaint and of course you get the letter back and they will write you a letter and it's we'll take it under consideration and blah, blah, blah but you wait about two months and you never heard a cotton pickin' word. Hey, you think, this isn't right so you write another letter to the Qualification Commission and the same old thing. We acknowledge your letter, we will take it under consideration, blah, blah, blah, and you wait another two months. So you write another letter to the Judicial Qualification Commission. The same old story. About this time you are beginning to think, you know, I have to do something about this so you make a phone call down to the Judicial Qualification Commission and say, do you want to know what is going on? Well it is being considered but...and you say what has happened? Well we can't tell you what has happened. The judges have a confidentiality that you people voted in in 1966 and so we can't divulge anything what we do to a judge. You scratch your head a little bit and you will say, well why can't we? You said, who are you working for? Are you working for the people of the State of Nebraska or are you perhaps working for the judges? Are you trying to hide something? And there at the Commission the person says, listen, I'm just carrying out the wishes of the people of the State of Nebraska. They put it in the Constitution that judges are on a different standard so that is just the way it is. So you go home and then you contact Senator X, that happened to be me. So I decided, what can I do about this? So I am going to try to change this law so the judges aren't any different than you or I. I passed out some stuff to you a little while ago and one of them came
