LB 660, 886, 809

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to place directly on General File.

SENATOR CLARK: Both bills are placed directly on General File. Do you have anything else to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kahle would like to print amendments to Legislative Bill 886 and Senator Pappas to 660. (See pages 1385-1386 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have.

SENATOR CLARK: We now go to LB 809.

CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Bill 809, well Mr. President, the first item I have on 809 is a unanimous consent request from Senators Higgins, Labeledz, Pirsch, Vard Johnson, Withem, Hefner, Morehead, Wesely, Kilgarin, McDonald, Scofield, Hoagland, Von Minden, Pappas, Schmit, DeCamp, Hannibal, and Remmers to add their names as co-introducers.

SENATOR CLARK: Any objection? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Bill 809 was a bill introduced by Senator Newell. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 5 of this year, was referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. Senator, do you want to take up your amendment now or...Mr. President, Senator Newell has an amendment to his bill. Senator Newell's amendment is on page 1340 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell on the amendment to the bill.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this amendment is a very simple amendment. It basically states that all tax statements that are sent out on one's home will have the amount of the exemption that is authorized by the state, the taxes otherwise due and a statement that it is reimbursed. That means the exemption is reimbursed by the state. The purpose for this amendment
