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a terrible mistake we are making. I would feel the guilt when I read in the paper that some elderly person has not been able to obey a traffic rule and was killed by a truck, or a train, or what have you, or worse yet injured severely and laying in a hospital. I think we are making an awful big mistake. I'm sure that some of the elderly don't want to take that test because they are afraid they can't pass it. I'm sure that some of them shouldn't be on the road. I know that taking your wheels away from you is terrible. I've been through that with some of my in-laws, as I mentioned the other day. But I do not want the responsibility of saying you can drive without taking a test. I think it is too dangerous. I think we have way too much speed on our highways and congestion that we didn't have 20, 30, 40 years ago when most of these people learned to drive and that we're making an awfully big mistake. I also think we made a mistake when we did away with the testing of automobiles, but that is another issue, checking of the systems on our automobiles. But just because the elderly write in and say they don't want to take the test and it makes them nervous may be just the very reason they shouldn't be driving. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Chambers. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I rise to urge the advancement of this bill. At the risk of being repetitious I would remind you that every time you read a newspaper, listen to a radio, or watch a television news program they have never yet said anybody was killed or maimed because a driver did not know the rules. All of these accidents have come about as a result of speed, reckless driving, and drunken driving. It isn't just the elderly that think this is unnecessary. As I've said before, your driving record proves whether or not you know the rules of the road. Remember, this bill only applies to people who have gone four years without an at fault accident, and without a violation. As Senator Marsh said, well a lot of people break the rules and they don't get caught. Is there any Senator on this floor that wants to stand up and say when I was in a hurry I never ever slowed down for a stop sign and looked, and nobody was coming so I
