the appropriation bill itself.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, and that is not going to be in the appropriation bill itself. Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the bill? The motion is to advance LB 882. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 882 is advanced. Next is LB 1128.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1128 was a bill introduced by the Appropriation Committee and signed by its members. (Title read.) The bill was read for the first time, Mr. President, on March 6 of this year. It was referred directly to General File. I have a series of amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, do you want to describe the bill or shall we go to the amendments?

SENATOR WARNER: We might as well do the amendments.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment is offered by Senator Warner as Chairman of the Budget Committee. It is found on page 1508 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, there are three amendments offered to the bill as it was introduced and we divide up into three to facilitate discussion of the three issues. The first one is a general reduction in a variety of agencies from the level of appropriation as the bill was introduced. The second amendment deals with the special session's cut as a separate item, a total of \$3.9 million. We did suggest, although it does not show on the sheets yet, that that could be funded as one alternative by an amendment which is already filed on LB 962 which would lap the interest from the half cent sales tax fund, the interest
