cost, very small. I say to you that it is a matter of fairness and I know what Senator Chambers means that sometimes when you are right it is lonely. I would say to you, you better think about this issue at least one more step. Then if you truly can't accept it, you have a chance there. It is not going to hurt anyone at this point to advance this one more step. Is it fair for the taxpayers in 90 counties to subsidize 3 counties' use? That is not fair. Is it fair for the taxpayers to take more than their disproportionate share of this? Let's address this issue. I ask you to advance LB 827. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 867 (sic.) Excuse me, 827. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record your vote aye or nay on the motion to advance the bill. The Chair will allow 15 seconds for recording of votes. The motion is to advance LB 827. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote. Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I want a record vote, please.

PRESIDENT: A record vote has been requested. We will have order in the Chamber, please.
