The motion is to advance LB 229 on a motion by Senator Beutler to advance the bill from General File to Enrollment and Review for review. Are there members of the Legislature in the rotunda who might come in and take part in the proceedings? If there are members of the Legislature in the rotunda, we have a motion on the floor which needs some assistance either pro or con. CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 790.

CLERK: Mr. President, 790 introduced by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 5 of this year. It was referred to the Public Works Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Public Works Committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner. Senator Schmit on the committee amendments, I guess.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the bill is a bill which provides a penalty for the parking of railroad cars at crossings. The committee amendments provide for the situation to be reviewed on a
