LB 724. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried, the amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fenger would move to amend. The Fenger amendment is on page 1614 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Fenger.

SENATOR FENGER: Thank you, Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Legislature, this amendment is largely technical in nature. The only substantive language contained in the amendment is that which would add a new section specifically granting the Health Department rule and regulation making authority in conjunction with this the Nurse Practitioner Act. But before promulgating rules and regs. the Health Department would be required to consult with both the Board of Nursing and the Board of Examiners in Medicine and Surgery. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the Fenger amendment. Is there discussion? If not, all those in favor of adopting the amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. We are on Select File. It requires 25 votes for an amendment. The Speaker has asked me to announce that we are going to continue our session through the noon hour and we will take up LB 994 at 1:30. The motion is the adoption of the Fenger amendment to LB 724. Please record your vote. The Chair would like to persuade members, wherever you are in the rotunda or elsewhere to come on in and give us your assistance on these bills on Select File so that we expedite these measures either pro or con. Members, please come on into the Chamber and record your vote. We are voting on an amendment by Senator Fenger to LB 724. May we please have some cooperation. I think there are members in the rotunda who might come in and give us their assistance on expediting of Select File bills.
