CLERK: Madam President, LB 829, by Senator Wesely. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 5 of this year. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending.

SENATOR LABEDZ: There are committee amendments? Senator Barrett, committee amendments.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Madam President and members. Very briefly stated 829 enacts the definition of the term "supervisor" to be applied to the Commission of Industrial Relations when they are trying to determine the membership of a bargaining unit. The committee amendments provide very simply that an employee who primarily performs bargaining unit work and who does not perform substantial supervisory duties shall be included in the bargaining unit; and secondly it clarifies that any change in the law, caused by the bill in terms of determining bargaining units, would not affect existing laws regarding fire fighters and policemen. I would move the committee amendments.

SENATOR LABEDZ: There are no lights on. All those in favor of the committee amendments to LB 829 please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Labeledz voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Labeledz voting yes.
