SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam Chairman, Mother Labeledz...

SENATOR LABEDZ: Whatever.

SENATOR HABERMAN: ...members of the Legislature, I would respectfully ask this body to reject the committee amendments that are being offered so that we can go ahead and take the new amendments that are going to be offered to what Senator Kahle just told you. So I would like to ask the body to vote on the committee amendments and vote red.

SENATOR LABEDZ: There are no other lights on, Senator Haberman, so we will now vote on the committee amendments. Senator Kahle, you didn't want to close?

SENATOR KAHLE: Just, Madam President, this is correct. We had a bunch of things put in this bill at one time and as I understand some of them have been put into another bill so what we need now is a clean bill strictly for the Environmental Control.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Kahle. All those in favor of the committee amendments to LB 1078 vote aye, all opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Labeledz voting no.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Please record.

CLERK: 0 ayes, 19 nays, Madam Chair, on adoption of the Committee amendments.

SENATOR LABEDZ: The committee amendments are rejected.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President, I urge the body to accept the new amendments to LB 1078 to clear up this problem that we've had since 1980. It is a Department amendment and it has their okay, the committee's okay, and I would ask this body to adopt the new amendment to 1078 which become the bill.
