SENATOR LABEDZ: The bill is advanced. LB 949. Mr. Speaker, would you please step over here, please. LB 949 is introduced by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. Senator Hefner is excused so we are going to pass over LB 949 and go to LB 530 introduced by Senator Warner. Senator Warner is excused. Senator Newell, do you want to go on 1093, public radio? On the reverse side of your agenda, LB 807 introduced by Senator DeCamp. We are going to have to skip all over the rest of them.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, is Senator Beyer here? Okay, Mr. President, this is going to be a little different. The amendment up there that Senator Beyer, and I will withdraw any amendments I've got and everything else, Senator Beyer has an amendment. I go along 100 percent with his amendment. It completely guts the bill and uses the bill for a purpose that has been discovered recently relating to this same subject which is the whole central indexing. I suggest you adopt his amendment and advance the bill. The amendment makes the bill completely noncontroversial but it is necessary to get this other correction or the county officials are going to have convulsions and hemorrhages all summer as a result of something else they have discovered in the law. So Senator Beyer can offer his amendment and I will let him do it.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator DeCamp, there is a series of amendments and I'm afraid the Clerk will have to walk through those. Just a moment.

SENATOR DECAMP: I'll just withdraw everything I've got and anything else anybody else has. (Laughter.)

SENATOR LABEDZ: You're not in committee now, Senator DeCamp. Senator Beyer, would you like to explain your amendment? Oh, the Clerk is going to go through the rest of the amendments first and then we will get to yours. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Well, I'm looking, Senator. I've withdrawn...Senator DeCamp had two separate amendments. He wants to withdraw those. The next amendment I would have to
