SPEAKER NICHOL: \$4 million just for that one?

SENATOR VICKERS: That is the reason for the \$5 million and the answer to Senator Warner a little bit ago.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there anything further on the bill? I assume the...ready to have the bill to move. The motion is to move the bill from Select File to Enrollment and Review for engrossment. All those in favor of advancing the bill say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Now then, we move to LB 341.

CLERK: Mr. President, 341, I have a series of amendments to the bill. The first I have, however, are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, the E & R amendments to LB 341.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move that we adopt the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Newell. Senator Newell, this amendment is on page 1217 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell and asks for order in the Chamber. (Gavel.)

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is a very simple little amendment. It strikes the Lamb amendment that was offered on General File. Very simply, Senator Lamb offered an amendment that he argued would benefit the receiving schools, receiving meaning those schools that receive students from Class I's and as I said right after the debate on the issue, that I thought that Senator Lamb had not fully explained the issue
