I wonder if it would be possible for Senator Hefner, perhaps, and Senator Peterson and Senator Beyer and Senator Schmit and maybe another one or two and myself to get together over noon and see if we can come up with language that we could all live with rather than fighting that out here on the floor. That would be a suggestion. I see that it is noon anyhow.
