SENATOR HABERMAN: And in your opinion...okay, thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: For the Page who is coming, please go down to my office and get something. Thanks. I need to ask several questions and my first one is of Senator Vard Johnson. I thought I heard you say when you originally started speaking, and that would be part of the amendment, that it only applied to where there was no insurance.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR MARSH: Do you mean federal insurance?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Federal insurance.

SENATOR MARSH: I thought we had some state insurance and I am not quite clear on what you were trying to imply by your comment.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Right. There never was any state insurance as such. It just means federal insurance.

SENATOR MARSH: All right. Thank you. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes.

SENATOR MARSH: Is the \$10 million a figure that we could negotiate? I think it may be some place between ten and five for a realistic figure. Or is there a possibility that if we leave it at ten it could still be negotiated between now and Select File and that there might be a consortium of Nebraska institutions who might choose to do something about the situation?

SENATOR DECAMP: Sure is a reasonable approach.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. I expect to support the amendment.
