SENATOR CARSTEN: Have you got any lights on?

SENATOR CLARK: I have got some lights on but I don't know what they are on for. Senator Newell, do you want to talk on the advancement? All right, the question before the House then is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1892-1893 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. Mr. Speaker, do you want to take up 930? All right, we will go to 930 now. I don't mean this evening either.

CLERK: Mr. President, right before that, if I may, Senator Hoagland would like to print amendments to 845; Senator Newell to 1124. (See pages 1893-96 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, LB 930 was introduced by the Education Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 9. It was referred to the Education Committee for hearing. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Vickers on the committee amendments.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I would ask the body to vote no on the committee amendments because the committee in the committee amendments attempted to reenact LB 933 of a few years ago that was brought, if you will recall, on a revisor's bill, that issue was brought to us by Senator Scofield. We included that in our hearing and we included that then in the committee amendments. We have since come to the understanding that that is no longer necessary to reenact that. So I would ask you to vote no on the committee amendments and we will have another amendment
