education and students, instead of strictly teachers and their power, you will continue to have a deteriorating system of education and you will continue to have a lousily, poorly financed system of education with property taxes at the highest levels. The NSEA may threaten you but they cannot beat you if you go out and talk to your people and tell them the problems. The NSEA is powerful. They are not the Supreme God. And until such time as some members start standing up to them, we will not deal with the problems of education. I urge you to not vote for the bill and I will withdraw the proposal.

SENATOR CLARK: It is withdrawn and the Clerk will read the bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1126 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law according to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Voting no.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1910-1911 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 34 ayes, 10 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. That completes Final Reading. We will go to #6, the priority bills, LB 852.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 852 (read title). The bill was referred to the committee on Public Works. They reported the bill back to General File. The bill was considered on March 26 and at that time when we left the bill we were considering an amendment that was offered by Senators Schmit and Hefner and that amendment is found on page 1861.
