CLERK: May I read some things in first?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, go right ahead.

CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, I have some study resolutions, LR 329 by the Banking Committee. It calls for a study of commerce within the State of Nebraska and the exercise of legislative oversight over existing legislation governing that subject. 330 is by the Banking Committee. It calls for a review and examination of the conduct of the banking industry within the State of Nebraska. 331 by the Banking Committee calls for a review of the conduct of the insurance industry within the State of Nebraska. 332 by the Banking Committee calls for review of maintaining legislative oversight over the central indexing system. 333 by Senator DeCamp calls for a study to examine transient merchants in Nebraska. Transient merchants, Senator. That is yours. It is undefined I might add. 334 by Senator DeCamp calls for a study of the Nebraska export industry in Nebraska. SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will take up 886.

CLERK: Mr. President, when we left 886 I had pending an amendment by Senator Vard Johnson to the bill. I believe copies of Senator Johnson's amendment have been distributed.
