CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman has an amendment to the bill. Senator Haberman has left.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner. May I please have your attention a moment so that we can hear Senator Warner speak on his bill. Thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would just move the bill be advanced. I would like to make one comment. I raised the question of germaneness relative to an amendment which I suspect we will be doing off and on this time of session every year. It was a legitimate issue and that was the only reason it was raised and it is unfortunate that some apparently took offense at doing that but I suppose that will happen again before the session is over, too, several times but I would hope the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Newell, did you wish to speak? Senator Warner, did you wish to close? The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. A machine vote has been asked. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance 830.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 830 advances. LB 807.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have on 807 are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I move that we approve the E & R amendments.
