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special salary adjustment in the Department of Education. The reason we include the special salary with this is that in the program in which the Driver Ed money is also has a salary adjustment automatically put to one without the other and that being the case it made sense to do it all at one time. As Senator Wagner pointed out earlier, this is reimbursement to school districts that have already spent the money. They get the funds in September for the '83-'84 year. It is funded from the general fund but at the time in 1981 when I was responsible for offering or encouraging Senator Koch at that time or I offered, I do not recall, placing the money in the general fund as opposed to a special fund, but I would urge that the veto of that Driver Ed money be overridden. If in the future you want to discontinue it next year then introduce a bill, reduce the driver license fee by the amount that it has been increased over the years to fund this activity. But at this point let's reimburse the schools for the expenditures they have made and could reasonably and properly expect.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wagner. Senator Wagner is up.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker and members, I rise again to support the Driver's Ed. And I would like to call your attention to the agreement that was made back in 1981 here on the floor between Senator Koch and Senator Warner. And essentially what we did, we increased those driver license fees from \$7 to \$10 and in checking this morning there is, in the last year there is three hundred and forty-four thousand, three hundred and four times three is over a million dollars that we get there, and those funds are meant for the Driver's Ed and for that reason I rise to support the motion.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, are there other lights on? I will just wait and close if there are.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, there are quite a few.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, I will close then.

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
