SENATOR BEUTLER: So it is an equally high standard?

SENATOR WESELY: I think, yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and then subsection 1 of the amendment, what does that do, the language about containing 1 percent or more alcohol by volume? that relate to?

SENATOR WESELY: I think...well they needed to clarify the definition to alcohol blended gasoline with that definition but it doesn't change the definition of gasohol for the tax exemption purposes. So they needed that clarification of what exactly is alcohol blended gasoline.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any other discussion? The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. LB 767A.

CLERK: I have nothing on 767A, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It advances. LB 835A.

CLERK: Mr. President, on 835A Senator Carsten has an amendment pending. That is on page 1220 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I would move for the adoption of the amendment. This is really a technical amendment from the...in the wording of the bill from the fiscal office. It doesn't change the amount of money any nor does it change the fund source, the general fund. All it does is to...it does change the personnel service wording so that these funds may be used for the department's personnel service budget, line item, which is the way the bill was intended to begin with. Actually it is just a technical correction that the fiscal office caught and asked us to change it. I would move for its adoption.
