SENATOR NEWELL: It seems to me that the decisions could be made later in the day or tomorrow as well as they can be made today. Now I resent very much the change of agenda. I resent very much the rush to judgment. I also resent Bill Swanson's effectiveness in this regards. I think we ought to reconsider, we ought to make sure that we have these options open to us as a fiscally responsible Legislature if we are not going to be a fiscally conservative Legislature.

The question is the suspension of the rules so that the Clerk may send the bills to the Secretary of State. This is one vote, 30 votes required. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
