SENATOR LAMB: If we could, if the Speaker is here, if we could move it somewhere on the agenda today so that it can be returned before...you know, so we can get the bill passed, bottom of Final Reading or somewhere on the agenda today, that would be perfectly acceptable.

SENATOR DECAMP: Why not print the amendment in the Journal, give us a chance to find out what it does?

SENATOR CLARK: We could delay it to the bottom of Final Reading.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, you know there isn't time to put it...as I understand it we have to have that brought back for the specific amendment today so to print it in the Journal is too time consuming but we could have it duplicated and circulated and then bring the bill back if it was acceptable to the Speaker sometime today so that people do have an opportunity to look at the amendment.

SENATOR DECAMP: Could I just ask a question is all, does it do anything substantive or is it strictly technical? Does it change any priorities or lien rights in that respect in any way?

SENATOR LAMB: I think it would be better for you to look at it yourself. I think the Speaker is wanting to be recognized.
